I am writing on behalf of Cranberry Township to express our wholehearted support for the funding application submitted to the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) for the Gateway 228 – Mars RR Bridge Extension Project. The funds sought are crucial for advancing the final phase of the Gateway 228 project, which holds immense significance for Butler County and the surrounding region.

The Gateway 228 project encompasses the State Route 228 (SR 228) corridor, including SR 228 and State Route 3020 (Freedom Road), spanning a 26.4-mile distance across seven municipalities. Cranberry Township, with its diverse and thriving economy, stands to benefit greatly from the completion of this project. As a regional retail center with easy access to Pittsburgh, Cranberry Township is also emerging as a hub for technology, engineering, and customer service industries. Since 2018, significant progress has been made on the Gateway 228 project, thanks to previous BUILD grants totaling \$45 million. However, the completion of the Mars RR Bridge Extension, the final segment of the project, remains essential. This last phase involves widening SR 288 and integrating it seamlessly with the newly constructed Pittsburgh Street Intersection Improvement project, covering a distance of 3.25 miles. The requested USDOT funds are imperative for ensuring the successful completion of this critical infrastructure project.

Investing in Route 228 will have far-reaching implications, including job creation, economic growth, and improved accessibility to previously isolated regions. Cranberry Township fully supports this pivotal transportation initiative and recognizes its importance in enhancing regional connectivity and facilitating economic development.
